

## Descendants of Jean Ranc

### Generation No. 1

1. JEAN1 RANC was born 1641 in Paris, Seine, France, and died 1712 in Manheim, Baden, Germany.

Fled Huguenot persecutions to Mannheim, Baden, Germany - 1685

From "The Ranck of the Rancks"- When in 1685 King Louis XIV, revoked the Edict of Nantes and resumed the unbridled persucution of the Protestants, ordering all Huguenot clergymen to leave France in 14 days, Rev. Jean Ranc, then 44 years of age, fled with his family from Paris to escape the death which would undoubtedly have been their lot.

When the persecution resumed with bitter vengeance, La Rochelle no longer existed as a haven and there was little political or military power to strain the vengeful King. Rev. Jean Ranc with his wife and son, Hans Valentine, fled first to the Alsatian city of Strasburg on the Rhine. It was not long until the armies of Louis recaptured the city, which throughout its history was sometimes German and sometimes French territory. The refugees had to flee even furthur down the Rhine to Mannheim, where the Rev. died.

There is some validity to connect him to Bernadin Du Ranc, Seigneur De Vibrac. But it is impossible to make a direct connection other than to suggest that he was the younger son, cadet, who did not inherit the title.

Hans Valentine was the only child of Jean Ranc and his wife whose name is unknown.

The winter of 1708-1709 was very long and cold in the Rhineland. It was a very bleak period. People huddled around their fires as they considered quitting their homes and farms forever. By early April, the land was still frozen and most of the Palatines' vines had been killed by the bitter weather. Since 1702 their country had been enduring war and there was little hope for the future. The Thirty Years War lay heavy on their minds, a period in which one out of every three Germans had perished.

The Palatines were heavily taxed and endured religious persecution. As the people considered their future, the older ones remembered that, in 1677, William Penn had visited the area, encouraging the people to go to Pennsylvania in America, a place where a man and his family could be free of the problems they were now encountering.

To go to America meant a long, dreadful ocean voyage and a future in an unknown land, away from their past and family. Everyone knew that the German Elector would stop any migration as soon as it was noticed. Only a mass exodus from the Palatinate could be successful. Many wondered how they could ever finance such a journey even if they wanted to attempt it. Small

boats, known as scows, would have to be acquired for the long ride down the Rhine River and then there was the price for the ocean voyage. While some of the people had relatives that could assist them financially, many were very poor. Soon enough, their minds were made up for them as France's King Louis XIV invaded their land, ravaging especially the towns in the Lower Palatinate.

In masses, the Palatines boarded their small boats and headed down the Rhine for Rotterdam. It was April 1709 and the first parties were afloat on the Rhine, many with only their most basic goods and their faith in God as their only possessions. The river voyage took an average of 4-6 weeks through extremely cold, bitter weather. By June, 1709, the people streamed into Rotterdam at a rate of one thousand per week. The Elector, as expected, issued an edict forbidding the migration, but almost everyone ignored it. By October, 1709, more than 10,000 Palatines had completed the Rhine River journey.

The Duke of Marlborough was assigned by Queen Anne to transport the immigrants to England. British troop ships were also used. The Queen assumed these Protestants would help fuel the anti-Roman feelings developing in England. The ships from Rotterdam landed, in part, at Deptford and the refugees were sent to one of three camps at Deptford, Camberwell, and Blackheath outside the city wall of London. Many Londoners welcomed the Palatines, but the poor were not, as they felt their English food was being taken from them to feed the Germans. British newspapers published mixed accounts of the Palatines, some praising them while others cursed them.

Meanwhile, streams of Palatines went to America, with most going to Pennsylvania. The ocean voyage was harsh, with over-crowded, under-supplied, and unsanitary ships. What provisions were supplied were generally the least expensive available to the ship's master. Water frequently ran out, as did food. Dreadful mortality occurred on many voyages. In addition to those woes, the Palatines faced robbery, deception, and worse from those transporting them.

Estimates on the number of Germans in Pennsylvania during this period varies from author to author, but a common estimate is 10,000-15,000 by 1727 and 70,000-80,000 by 1750. A good source for reviewing German arrivals to Pennsylvania is Rupp's "Thirty Thousand Immigrants in Pennsylvania" which contains numerous ship passenger lists and has an excellent surname index. Another good resource is Walter Knittle's "Early Eighteenth-Century Palatine Emigration".

Immigrants not only came from Germany, but also Bohemia and Switzerland. Most were either Lutheran, Reformed, or Mennonite in religious belief.

The State of the Poor Palatines As Humbly Represented By Themselves Upon Their First Arrival In This Kingdom, About June, 1709 (from London, England)

We the poor distressed Palatines, whose utter Ruin was occasioned by the merciless Cruelty of a Blood Enemy, the French, whose prevailing Power some years past, like a Torrent rushed into our Country, and overwhelmed us at once; and being not content with Money and Food

necessary for their Occasions, not only dispossess us of all Support but inhumanely burnt our House to the ground, where being deprived of all Shelter, we were turned into open Fields, and there drove with our Families, to seek what Shelter we could find, being obliged to make the cold Earth our Lodgings, and the Clouds our Covering. In this deplorable condition we made our Humble Supplications and Cries to Almighty God, who has promised to relieve them that put their Trust in him, whose Goodness we have largely Experienced, in disposing the Hearts of Pious Princes to a Christian Compassion and Charity towards us in this miserable condition, who by their Royal Bounties and large Donations, and the exemplary Kindness of well-disposed Nobility, Gentry, and Others, We and our poor Children have been preserved from Perishing; specially since our Arrival into this happy Kingdom of GREAT BRITAIN. While not only like the Land of Canaan, abounds with all things necessary for human Life, but also with a Religious People, who as freely give to the Distressed for Christ's sake, as it was given to them by the Almighty Donor of all they enjoy. Blessed Land and Happy People! Governed by the Nursing Mother of Europe, and the Best of Queens! Whose unbounded Mercy and Charity has received us despicable Strangers from afar off into Her own Dominions, where we have found a Supply of all things Necessary for our present Subsistence; for which we bless and praise Almighty God, the Queen's most Excellent Majesty and all Her good subjects, from the Highest Degree to those of the meanest Capacity; and do sincerely and faithfully promise to all our utmost Powers, for the future, to render ourselves Thankful to God, and Serviceable to Her Majesty, and all her Good Subjects, in what way soever her goodness is pleased to dispose of Us: and in the mean time be constant in our Prayers, that God would return the Charity of well disposed People a thousand fold into their own Bosoms, which is all the Requitall that can present be made by us poor distressed Protestants.

Chateau De Vibrac - Home!

The castle that was a gift for Charles Pierre du Ranc (my ancestor along with many others with the surname of Rank, Ranck, Ranc, Runk, Ronk, etc. who can trace their lineage back to Hans Valentine Ranc). The castle was reward for Charles' accompanying Christopher Columbus on his second voyage to the new world. The castle was built between 1510 and 1520 AD in Vibrac, France, just up the road from Durfort and Nimes. Chateau Vibrac - Home!

UPDATE

As of this summer, the castle has been sold by the Bonhomme family (the 3rd owners) to an English person whose friend is an artist and restorer presently working to restore the castle to it's original beauty. The castle sold for \$11 million and will need another \$40 million to restore. They plan to return the 76 rooms to the original 48

The History of the castle- (the castle is located in the south of France, between Nîmes and Alès, at the bottom of the "cevennes", at Durfort.)

The castle is very old, dating at least from the 13-14th century since one finds it mentioned in the origins of the commune on which it is located (it was already habited in 1350). In 1428 the Du RANC family live in the castle. In 1548 Bernardin Du RANC, lord of the castle, married on the 19th August Isabeau BLANZAC.

In 1551 the church of St-Martin de Sossenac was destroyed. In 1562 when they want to say the mass again, they will celebrate it in the castle, in an old pigeon house transformed into a vault. This vault still exists with its furnace bridge and the stoup.

One found in the bulletin of the academy of Nimes a study of Mr. de CAZENOVE which write about extracts of the synopses of the acts of baronnies (1252-1585). A register of the 16th century contains the summary mention of the acts passed by the Du RANC from and since their setting in possession of the ground of the castle.

A historian, Mr. RIVOIRE, in the statistics of Gard gives to this residence a Spanish origin whose principal authors would have accompanied Christophe COLOMB. The grounds of the castle would have been set up in baronnie into 1520. This one will exist until 1862 (November), date on which it returns to the commune.

The castle suffered from the wars of religion and the French revolution. In 1792 it was burnt. In 1823 the Du RANC sold to the comte d'ADHEMAR husband of Elisa, Céline MATHIEU, nephew

of a former mayor of the commune.

The castle was resold in 1864 to the RIVET DE SABATIER. Mr. Albert RIVET DE SABATIER bequeathed it to his elder son, Philippe, husband of Miss Jeanne ROUSSIN. Mr. Philippe RIVET DE SABATIER died in 1931, leaving his widow for heiress. In 1941 she bequeathed it to her brother-in-law, Louis RIVET DE SABATIER, which kept it until its death in 1958.

Mr. Philippe RIVET DE SABATIER let the square tower be repaired, at the top of which one sees in clear weather the sea. He did many repairs, created even two residences, but left it all in the old style.

### Armorial bearings of the castle

The armorial bearings carved on the chimneys of the green leaving-room and the dining room at the time of the restoration of the castle, as on the front gate where they replaced those of the baron Du RANC, were hammered at the time of the revolution of 1792.

### Interior in short

The principal part of the castle is made up of a score of rooms distributed on 3 levels (Ground + 2 floors).

At the Ground floor you have today 1 WC, 3 kitchens, a dining room and two living-rooms with chimneys. All these rooms have original "arched ceilings" (hauts plafonds voutés).

At the 1st floor, you have a bath-room with WC and 8 sleeping-rooms with chimney.

At the 2nd floor you have 3 sleeping-rooms and the possibility to have 4 or 5 other one.

I don't even speak about the boxrooms, wall cupboards, of the access to the tower and his terrace... A broad central stone staircase serves the stages.

### Dependences

The dependences are contiguous to the castle, they are part of it but totally independent. You have 2 renovated apartments for guardians with kitchen, WC and bath-room. There is a small cattle shed, a garage, stables, a hen house, barns with hay and for the possible hunters you have dog "houses" etc.

### The property

On a 4 ha ground with many different sorts of trees, you are surrounding the countryside (scrubland, vines, woods ...). Terraces, fountain, arched rosery, vault in ruin (partially), towers of

monitoring... forms part of the property and give it its charm. A private road gives you access to the property.

## General State

The castle was always inhabited, however it is today to renovate. Indeed, with such a seal (13th century), one can consider that the castle is from old design ;-).

For example, electricity is to be reactualized, the door frames are to be re-examined, of course there is no central heating, but a chimney in each part!, decoration is to be remade.

It then comes to each one to decide what they want : to transform at the today-standards (double-windows isolation, central heating, ultramodern bathrooms ...) or to make the place a little more comfortable (renovation of the door frames, of the bath-room and electricity, decoration) while preserving this inimitable medieval seal.

However here are the most significant things to know in order to make you an good idea before coming to visit us :

The roof, which is in good condition of structure, requires a revision which was quantified by a local contractor around 125,000 Frf (we can not guarantee this figure, which only engages the writer of the estimation. This estimation was required by an agency).

The external walls are in a perfect state.

Notes for HANS VALENTINE RANCK:

Hans died two years before his father Rev.Jean Ranc, leaving his children for their grandfather to raise. He too soon died. Rosine Katherine died 1712 at age 7. And Joann Valentine died in 1712 at age 2. The other children were left to be raised by their mother. Records remain only of John Michael and John Philip who became the first Rancks in America.

#### Notes for JOHN PHILIP RANCK:

Taken from "The Ranck of the Rancks", John Philip is number 1.1 in that book. The elder brother, John Michael, came to America in 1728. Strangely enough, brother John Philip was not on that passenger list. He waited in Rotterdam another year, sailing on June 20, 1729 on the very same vessel, the "Mortonhouse", making its next round to America. He arrived in Philadelphia on August 19, 1729, after a voyage of fifty-five days. No one knows for sure why both young men did not come at the same time. Romance may have been at stake, since this year later, John Philip brought with him a young bride, Anna Barbara Schumacher. Perhaps there was a rule that only married couples would be given passage. Or was the ship list overcrowded because of the unexpected passengers picked up at Mannheim and was John Philip the one for whom there was no room. Or did he not have the necessary fare. (It was estimated that it took a minimum of \$176.00 for the passage.)

A year later, John Philip and his bride were given about 243 acres adjacent to the east: Titles were granted to them in 1734 and 1751. These two farms, having been divided by 1978 in about 12 smaller farms, lie just southeast of New Holland, extending eastward past Blue Ball and East Earl to a tiny community called Fettersville, between PA. State Route 23 and the Welsh Mountains.

June 5, 1728, John Michael and Anna Barbara with 203 other emigrants, set sail from Rotterdam for America on the English ship "Mortonhouse". John Coultas was its master. After 81 days of rough ocean voyage crowded in the dismal holds of the ship, arrived in Philadelphia on August 24, 1728.

When John Michael and Anna Barbara arrived in Pennsylvania, they were allotted 7 or 8 hundred acres of land. The proprietary right to Pennsylvania, at William Penn's death had passed to his widow. When she died in 1733 it became the property of the three sons so that the formal deeds which were secured in 1742 and 1757 were signed by Thomas Penn.

Taken from "The Twentieth Century Biographical Dictionary of Notable Americans" vol IX. by Edward Sprague Rand.---- "Michael and Anna were Huguenots, and adherents of the Moravian church, who escaped from Holland in the English vessel Morton House, and landed in Philadelphia, PA., August 24, 1728, helping to found the town of New Holland."
